Similar to Office for Windows 10, Word, Excel and PowerPoint for Android tablets are built from the ground up for touch and are perfect for mobile productivity. Consider a pharmaceutical sales rep on a train in Chicago, updating her monthly budgets in Excel. Or a student in a Madrid coffee shop writing a paper in Word, while collaborating with other students back at the dorm. Or a consultant from Bangalore at his client's site, wirelessly projecting a PowerPoint presentation to a large screen. These are just a few scenarios our engineering teams anticipated when we designed the apps—for touch, on the go and tuned for Android tablets.

InfoPath Lives On

- Will Microsoft be shipping another version of InfoPath?
 - No, there will not be another version of the InfoPath desktop client or InfoPath Forms Services
- How long will InfoPath be supported?
 - The InfoPath 2013 client will be supported through April 2023.
 - InfoPath Forms Services for SharePoint Server 2013 will be supported until April 2023.
 - InfoPath Forms Services in Office 365 will be supported until further notice.
- What should I use to build and complete forms?
 - You should continue to use InfoPath technology.
 - FoSL was canceled
- Will there be a migration tool or process for the next generation of forms technology?
 - We'll provide more details on migration scenarios and guidance in Q4 of CY 2014.


New cloud storage integration for Office

Handwriting in OneNote for iPad and OCR everywhere


